Each criterion is weighted equally to promote a balanced focus on content, creativity, and presentation skills.

<b>Understanding of Concept</b>	Demonstrates a deep understanding of the assigned evolutionary pattern. Provide detailed explanations.	Shows a good understanding of most key points covered. <b>Visual Appeal</b>	Highly engaging and visually appealing; excellent use of images and graphics.	Visually appealing with good use of images and graphics.	Somewhat visually appealing; images/graphics could be improved.	Lacks visual appeal; poor use of images/graphics.	
<b>Organization</b>	Information is logically organized and easy to follow.	Well-organized with a few minor issues.	Some organizational issues. It may be difficult to follow at times.	Poorly organized; difficult to follow.	
<b>Creativity</b>	An extremely creative approach and a unique presentation style.	Creative approach with some unique elements.	Somewhat creative; lacks unique elements.	Little to no creativity is evident.	
<b>Peer Teaching</b>	Effectively teaches peers and engages the audience with thoughtful interaction.	Teaches peers effectively with some interaction.	Limited effectiveness in teaching peers; minimal interaction.	Ineffective in teaching peers; no interaction.
